










Bunny Strip Steelhead Jig Kit

Hook: Ball Head Jig Hook Size 1
Thread: Black 6/0 (not supplied)
Body: Rear ½ - White Cross Cut, Front ½ - Pink Cross Cut

Tools Required: Vise, Scissors, Bobbin

The Bunny Strip Jig is very effective. Small and compact, but creates a lot of motion and attraction. Flash can be a great optional addition to these jigs in off-colored water conditions.

	<p>STEP #1</p> <p>Insert Hook in Vise</p>
	<p>STEP #2</p> <p>Start thread at head and advance to half-way point between head and hook point.</p>
	<p>STEP #3</p> <p>Tie in white bunny strip piece at mid-point and make several wraps of thread. Add a couple half hitches and even head cement or super glue.</p>
	<p>STEP #4</p> <p>Begin wrapping bunny strip over the top of the hook shank. Make the first complete wrap to the rear of tie in point, then 3 or 4 overlapping wraps towards the head.</p> <p>Tie off, clip excess, make sever wraps to cover stubs and half hitch a couple times (can also add head cement here as well)</p>
	<p>STEP #5</p> <p>Tie in pink bunny strip piece and make several wraps of thread. Add a couple half hitches and head cement or super glue.</p>
	<p>STEP #6</p> <p>Begin wrapping bunny strip over the top of the hook shank. Make the first complete wrap to the rear of tie in point, then 3 or 4 overlapping wraps ending at the head.</p> <p>Tie off, clip excess, make sever wraps to cover stubs and half hitch a couple times.</p>
	<p>STEP #7</p> <p>Coat thread wraps with head cement and you are finished!</p>

Now, head for your nearest steelhead river and tie this jig to your leader. Use a float that is equally rated for the size of jig. Use bobber stops to adjust depth so that jig rides just above the bottom. Make sure the jig floats "dead" with no drag.
