








Cream Variant Catskill Mayfly

Thread: Cream (not supplied)  
Tail: Cream Hackle Fibers  
Body: Cream Quill Segment  
Hackle: Cream Hackle

Often referred to as the Pale Morning Dun. A classic Catskill Mayfly pattern.

**Note:** Soak the Quill Stem for about an hour in warm water.

	<p><b>STEP #1</b></p> <p>Insert Hook in Vise and start thread.</p>
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	<p><b>STEP #2</b></p> <p>Strip a clump of hackle fibers for the tail and tie in.</p>
	<p><b>STEP #3</b></p> <p>Lay down a base of thread and return to hook point.</p>
	<p><b>STEP #4</b></p> <p>Tie in quill segment and wrap forward to 1/8<sup>th</sup> inch behind the hook eye, half-hitch.</p>
	<p><b>STEP #5</b></p> <p>Tie in hackle half hitch and clip excess stem.</p> <p><i>Note: Coat the body with head cement for a more durable fly.</i></p> <p>Wrap hackle to hook eye, leaving room for the head. Tie down and clip excess.</p>
	<p><b>STEP #6</b></p> <p>Whip finish and apply head cement.</p> <p><b>Congratulations, you've completed the Cream Variant!</b></p>

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
